Introduction:

The policy handbook was created to help our volunteer members get acquainted with procedures at Discovery Lab Summer Camp. Volunteers are expected to follow their schedule at all time. These procedures have been established to create an effective and organized camp.

Hours:

Camp hours are 9:00 am to 3:00 pm. Volunteers **Must** be picked up on time. Volunteers are expected to complete the entire week session as our activities are ongoing and cannot be split. Once you start at the beginning of week you are expected to finish the activity as planned.

Mandatory Training Day:

Volunteers are expected to attend the mandatory training date. Date will be provided once you are notified that you are selected as a volunteer.



Lunch:

Volunteers must bring a snack/light lunch and a water bottle each day to camp.

Smoking in the workplace:

Telephone/Cell phones:

Activities:

Volunteers are expected to interact and help campers in all the activities offered in camp.



We encourage our volunteers to feel free to use their natural talent and creativity in the different activities we offer at camp.

Materials:

Volunteers will help the teacher/counselor prepare the activities/experiments of the day either day before or the morning of the activity so that all counselors will have the materials available. The volunteers are also responsible for collecting materials from the campers at the end of the day. Please make sure to keep your area clean.

Dress Code:

The camp has an assigned uniform: Discovery Lab Camp T-shirt (mandatory) Walking length shorts (khaki or jean) or pants. Sneakers or closed shoes (no sandals)

All volunteers shall maintain a well-groomed appearance at all times. Parents, visitors and most importantly our Jr. scientists, observe staff members. You are representing our camp by your appearance and behavior. * Discovery Lab T-shirts are not allowed to be worn outside the campgrounds. Camp uniform must be removed if planning to go out right after work.

Language:

All personnel and volunteers are expected to use appropriate language. Screaming to campers during activities is not acceptable and is a violation of the philosophy of our camp. Negative comments about campers will not be tolerated. If any incident might occur during the camp day; you must notify the camp director right away.

Cleaning:

All personnel are expected to clean after themselves with the help of the campers after every activity.



7 Volunteer Tips

- 1. We encourage volunteers to get down on the floor with the campers and get involved with the activities.
- 2. When talking with the campers get down at their eye level.
- 3. Always praise and encourage the campers to complete the activities and have fun.
- 4. Never leave the campers alone.
- 5. If a camper misbehaves, ask the teacher what to do until you are familiar with how situations are handled.
- 6. Don't discuss the campers behavior or appearance in front of other people or other campers.
- 7. At the end of the day, meet briefly with the teacher to discuss how your day went.
